


We serve

Millions of people, particularly women and children, die from preventable causes in countries affected by conflict and natural disasters.






Challenge 3: Better aid alone cannot improve lives unless it is accompanied by policy change. Solution: Use our influence


Challenge 5: The aid sector is driven by small, short-term grants that make long-term impacts harder to achieve. Solution: Stabilize our funding

Challenge 4: Inequalities of power not just in our sector, but in our organization. Solution: Invest in our people


