
Introduction



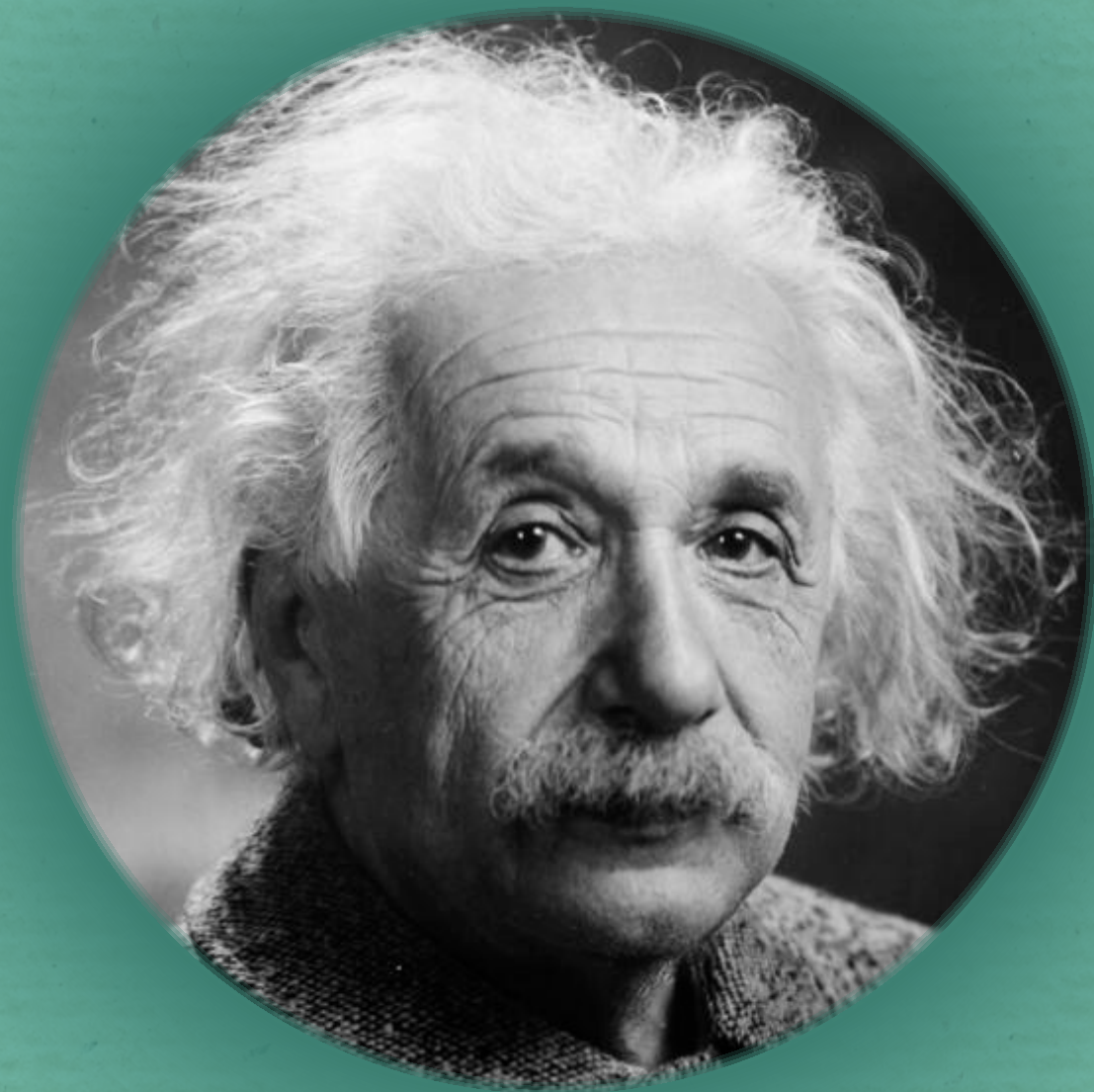
A global humanitarian aid, relief, and development organization.

History & Mission



Founded at the call of Albert Einstein in 1933.



Supported refugees from around the world.



During the Second World War, the International Rescue Committee started providing aid to people who were being persecuted.



Today it operates in more than 50 countries.

Economic wellbeing >

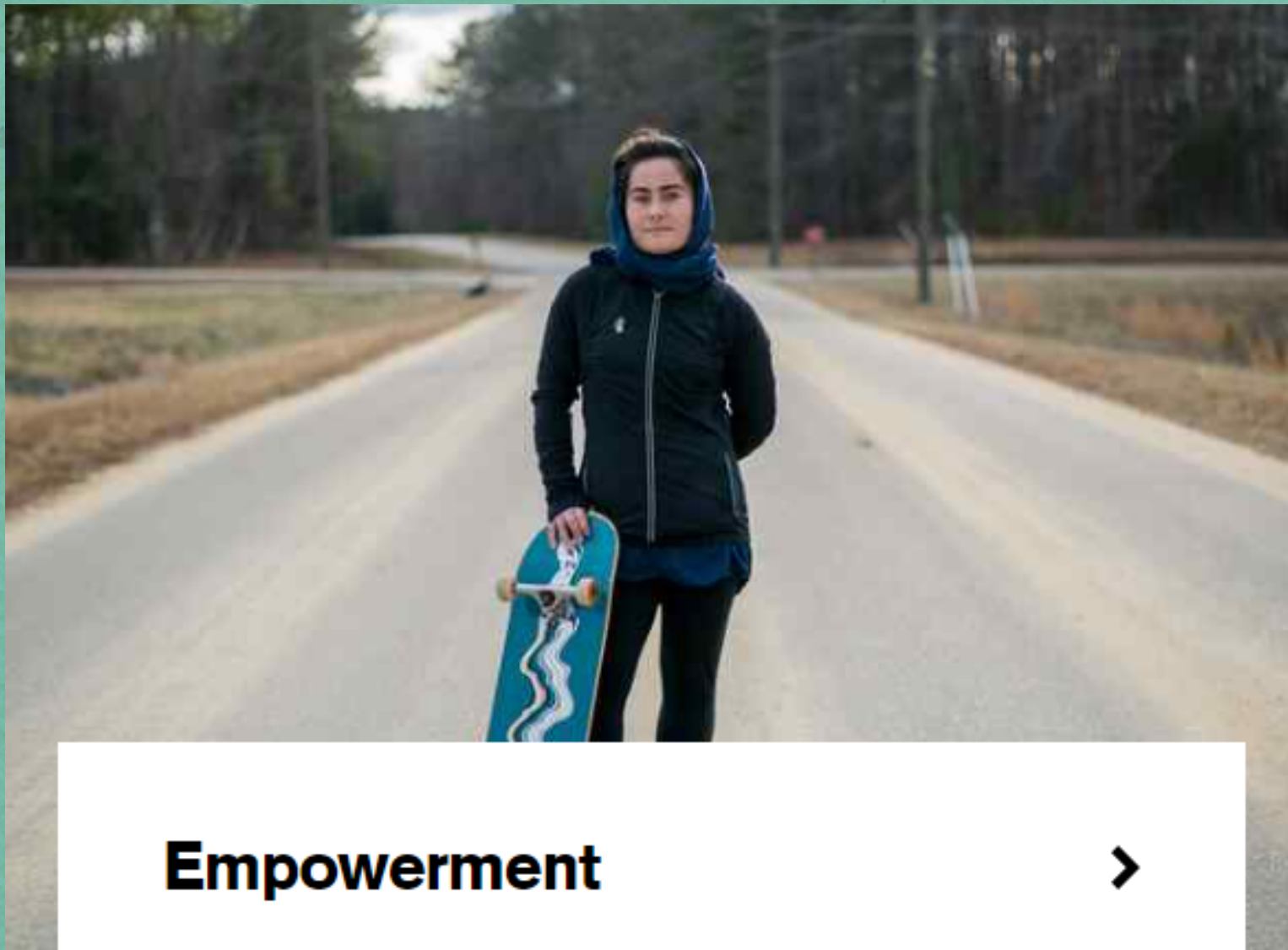
Economic wellbeing means people have their most basic survival needs met and have sustainable income and assets so they can prosper.



Education >

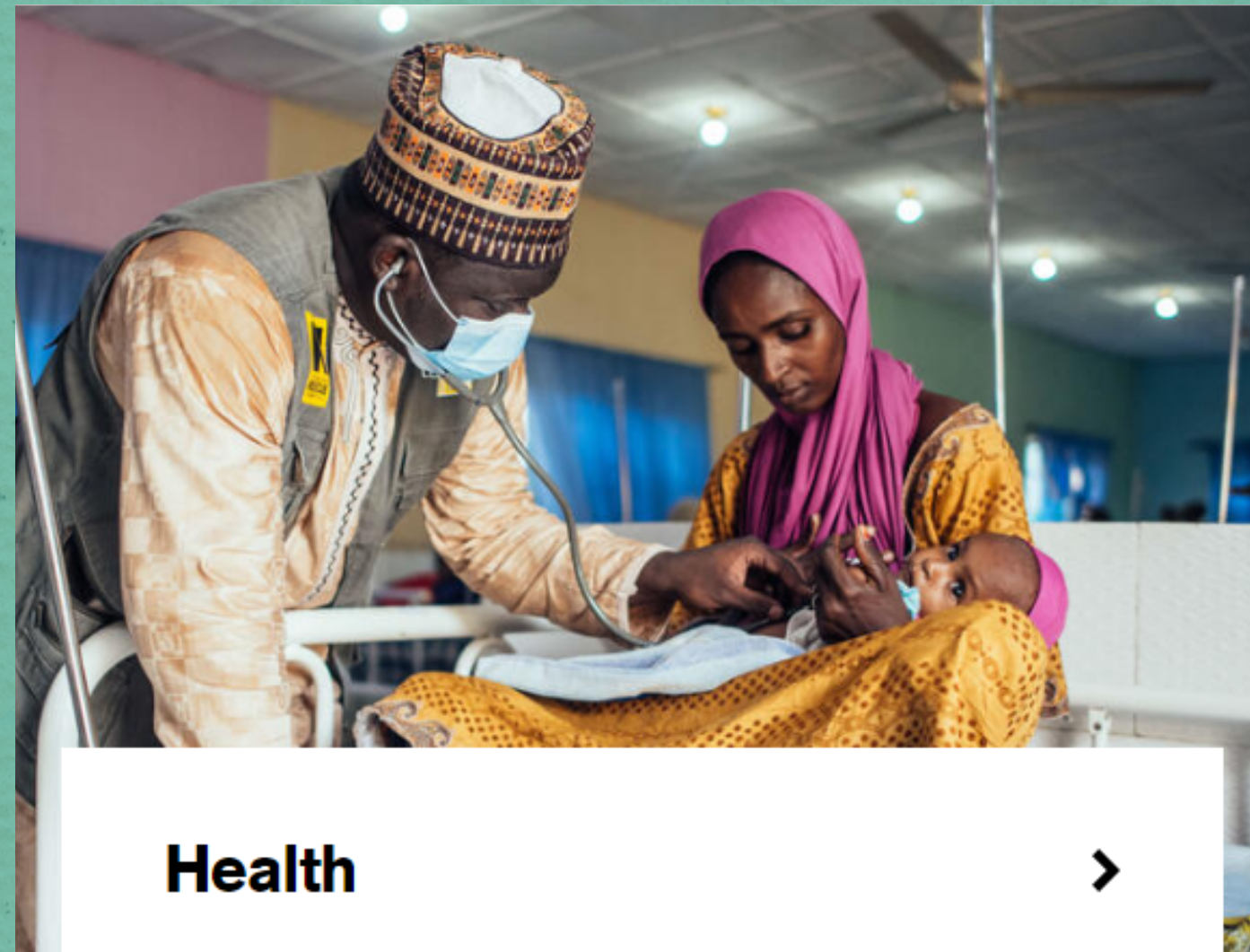
Education is the ultimate empowerment tool for children, their families and communities to survive and recover from conflict or crisis.

Health >

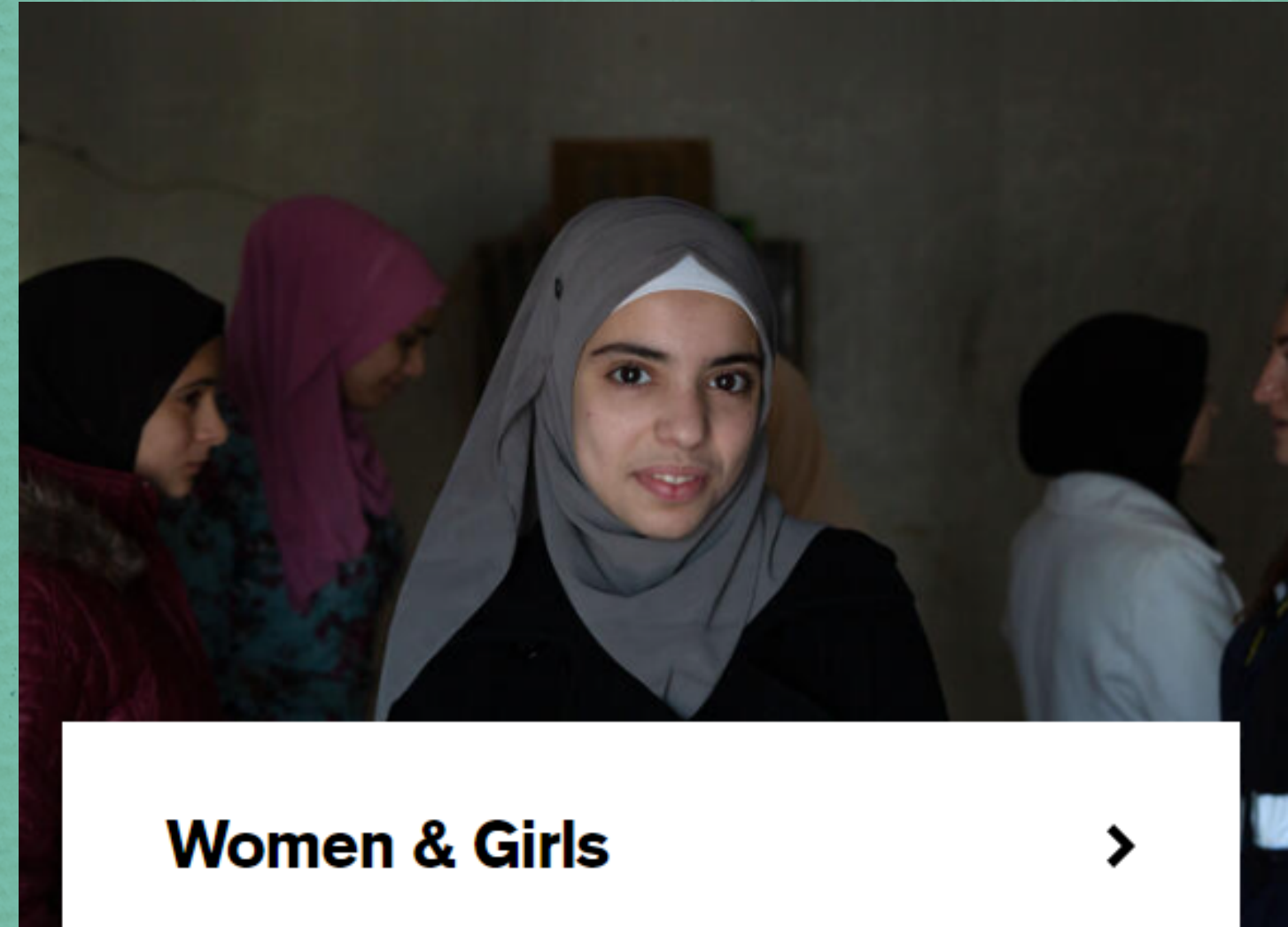
Millions of people, particularly women and children, die from preventable causes in countries affected by conflict and natural disasters.

people in countries affected by crisis were reached by the IRC and partners in 2022



As part of this work, IRC:

- Supported **3,137** health facilities
- Provided **8,013,515** primary health care consultations
- Treated **222,278** children under 5 for severe acute malnutrition
- Admitted **453,344** children and **106,722** pregnant and lactating women to nutrition programs
- Built or rehabilitated water supplies serving **3,490,159** people

... among other assistance provided around the world last year.

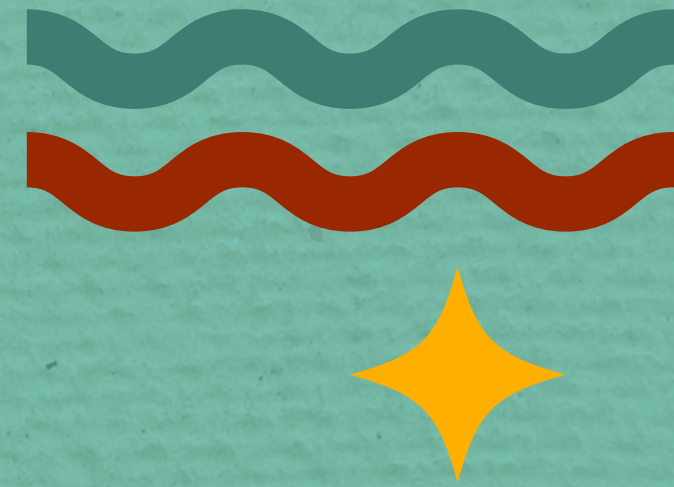

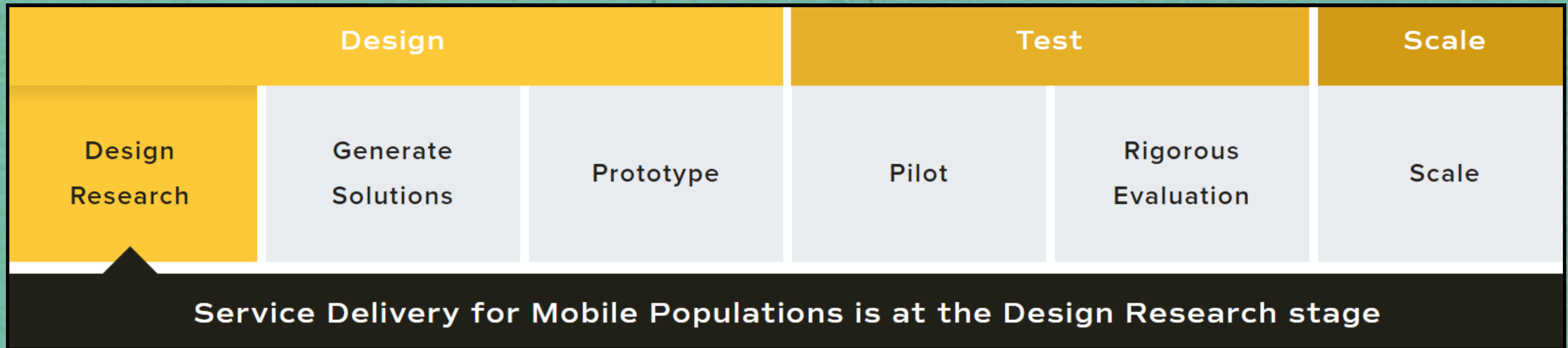

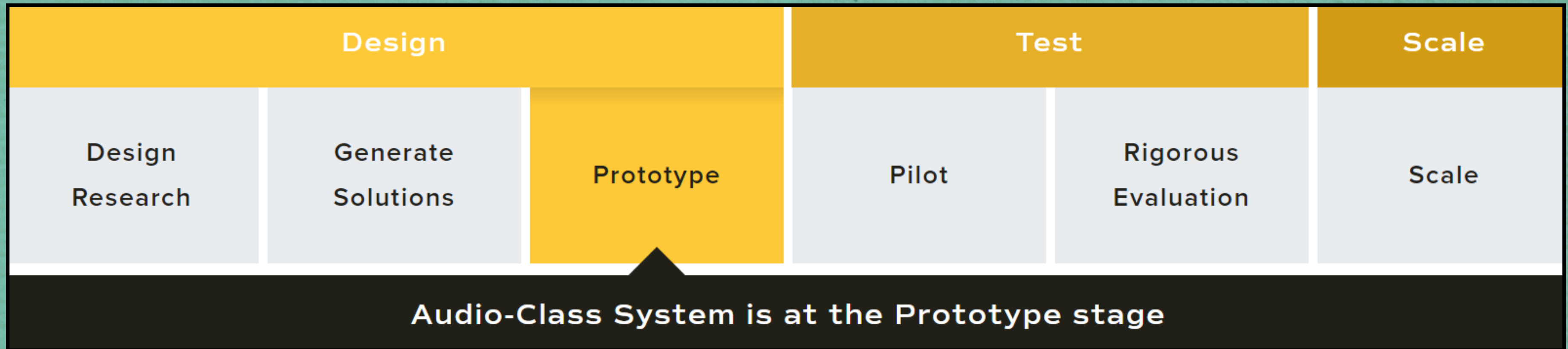

Challenges & Solutions

Challenge 1:

The number of people in need grows each year, but the global response has failed to keep pace.

Solution: Expand our scale

Challenge 2:

Aid programs put “band-aids” on problems, and too often take a “one-size-fits-all” approach to programming.

Solution: Empower people living in crisis

Challenges & Solutions

Challenge 3:

Better aid alone cannot improve lives unless it is accompanied by policy change.

Solution: Use our influence

Challenge 5:

The aid sector is driven by small, short-term grants that make long-term impacts harder to achieve.

Solution: Stabilize our funding

Challenge 4:

Inequalities of power not just in our sector, but in our organization.

Solution: Invest in our people

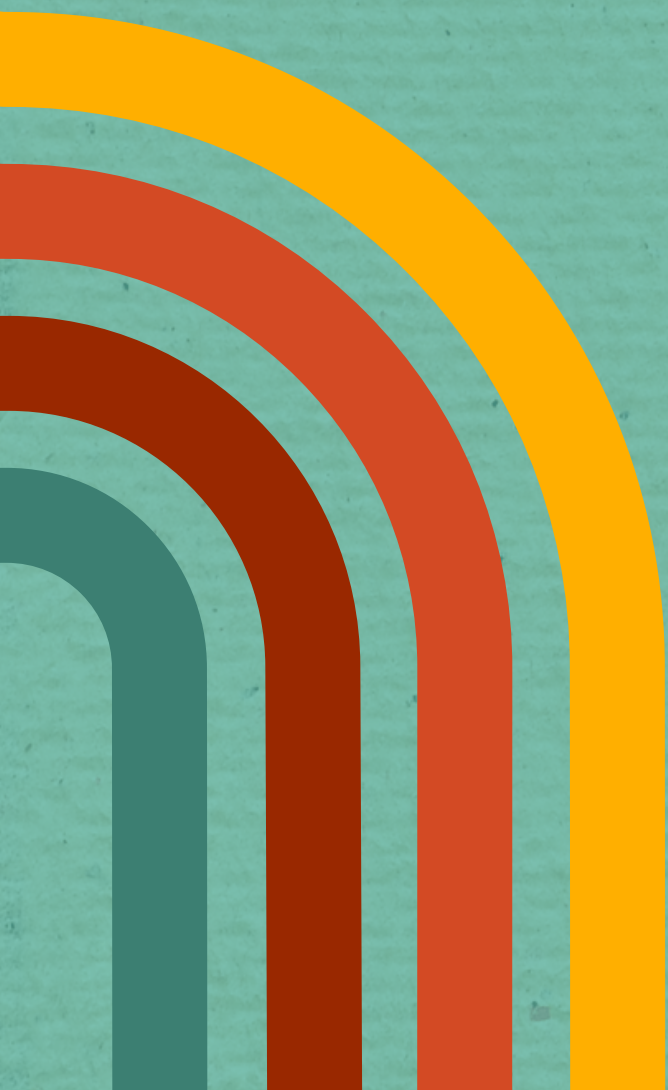
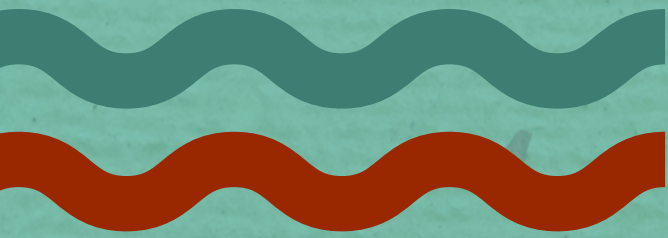
