About All Hands and Hearts

When?

- Two Organizations Joined forces for the earthquake in Nepal in 2015
- Officially merged in 2017 as All Hands and Hearts

Where?

- U.S. Based non-profit organization operating all around the world

Why?

- To effectively and efficiently address the immediate and long-term needs of global communities impacted by disasters
- «Arrives early stays late»

For Whom?

- Communities impacted by natural disasters around the World





Projects

- Teams: staff + volunteers
- Each project site is supervised by a staff member/trained team leader
- On the job training



Response

- Effective and efficient response to disasters, before transitioning to critical long-term rebuild projects
- Identify the greatest needs of the community (carefully listening to the community)
- Engaging volunteers, partners, local communities
- Immediate action
 - Mucking & gutting after a flood
 - Rubbling after an earthquake
 - Safe demolition to remove dangerous structures
 - Debris Removal
 - Chainsawing
 - Mold Sanitation

Recovery

- Long-term commitment
 - create a long-term action plan (execute with speed and real-time problem-solving)
- Rebuilding disaster-resilient homes, schools, daycare facilities, community centers
- Cutting-edge training
- Renewal-New ideas and creative solutions to help
 - Weekly movie nights for kids in Malawi
 - English tutoring sessions in the Philippines
 - Entrepreneurial and financial classes for secondary school girls in Peru
 - Thanksgiving dinners for hundreds of flood victims in Detroit

- WaSH hygiene training, including education on menstrual health

Ex: Shree Manakamana Basic School, 2015 Nepal Earthquake

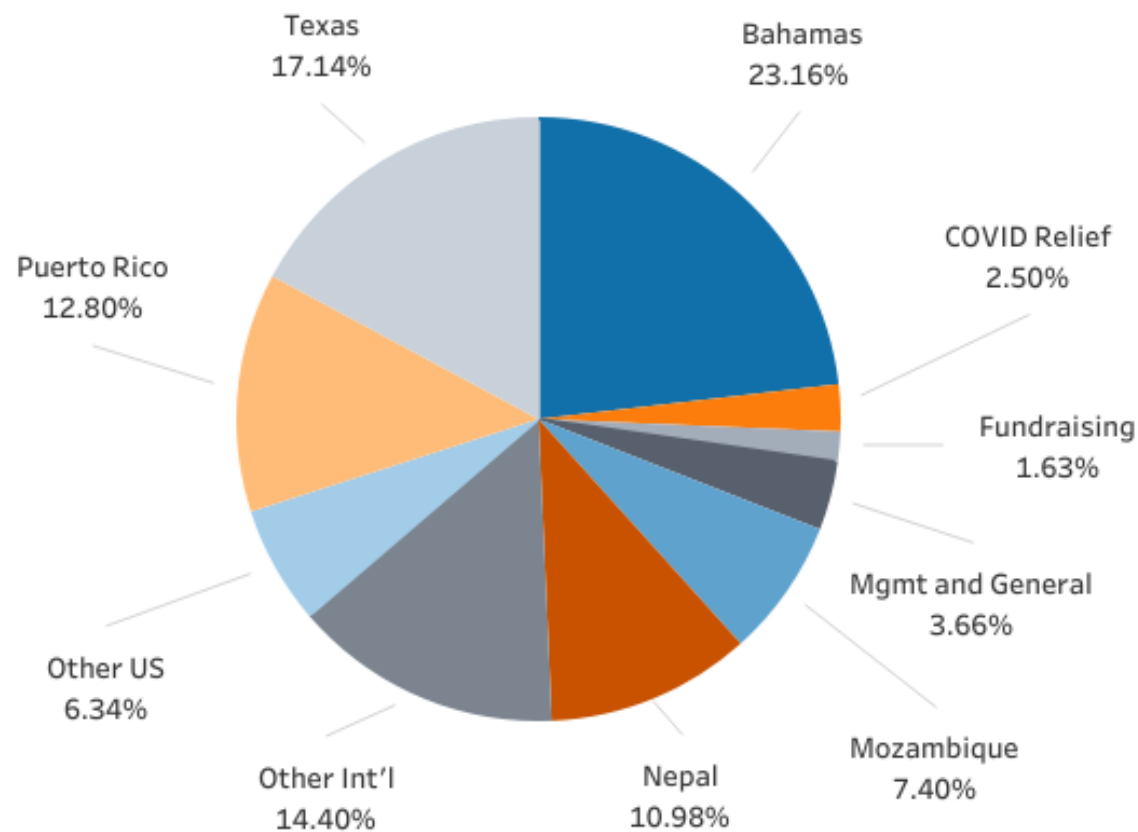

- Renewal projects –restoring critical infrastructure

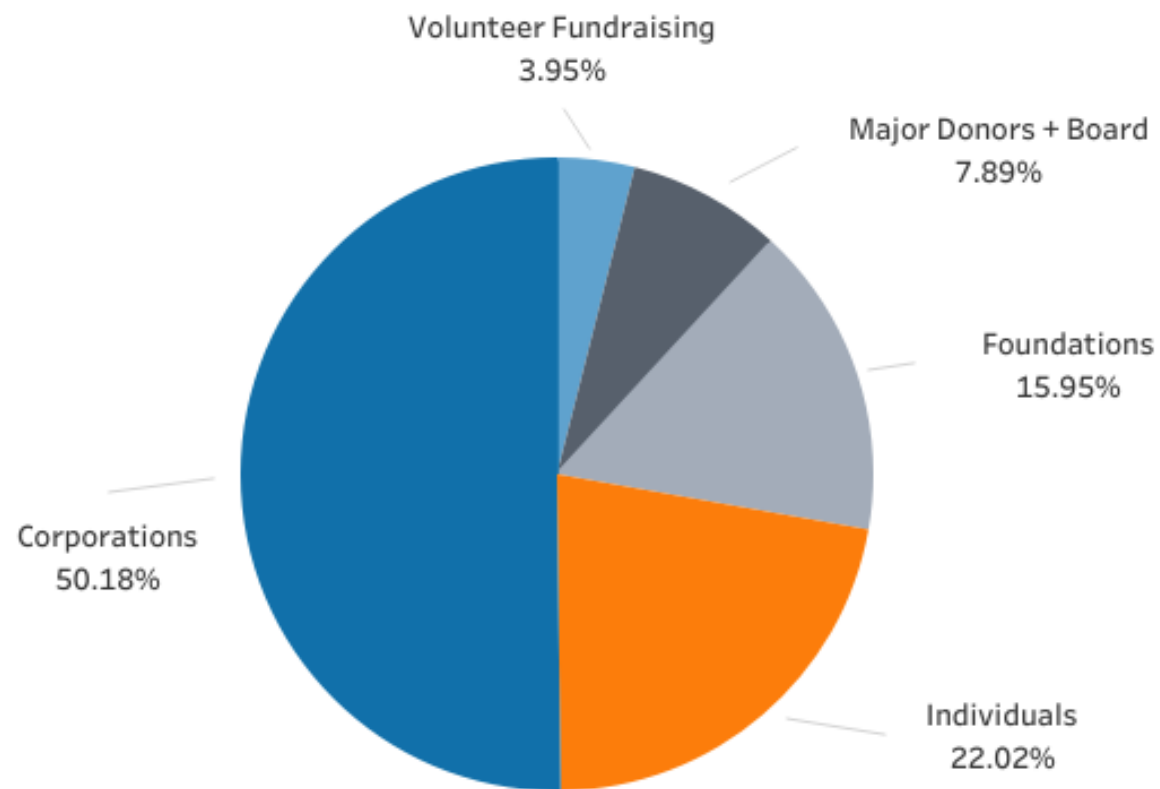

MAIN PROJECTS/ ACHIEVEMENTS



Hurricane Ida

 Louisiana, U.S.

 August 29th 2021

- A Category 4 Hurricane occurred
- Over 2 million people are affected
- Volunteer Work: Chainsawing, Debris Removal, Mud Removal and Preparation for Rebuilding
- Caused Floods in New York and New Jersey



The winds with 209-251 km/hour speed are Category 4 Hurricanes which are expected to bring catastrophic damages.

Australia Bushfire Relief

 Kangaroo Island & New South Wales, Australia

 June 2019

- WaSH: Water, Sanitation, Hygiene
- Volunteer Work: Maintaining basic WaSH properties including water tanks, shed for water catchment, water storage and bathroom containers

186,000 km² of forest were burned in Australia Bushfire 2019



Guatemala Hurricanes Eta and Iota Relief



Alta Verapaz Department, Guatemala



November 2020

- Both are Category 4 Storms
- Volunteer Work: Rainwater Catchment and Storage Stations





Mexico Earthquake Relief



Oaxaca, Mexico



September 7th 2017

- 2105 students were affected
- 1246 Volunteers participated
- 18 Schools are built
- Volunteer Work: Demolition of unsafe buildings, Rebuilding and refurbishing the schools, maintaining WaSH

Two earthquakes of magnitudes 8.2 and 7.1 occurred within two weeks in Mexico, 2017.



The Bahamas Hurricane Dorian Relief

 Abaco, Bahamas

 September 1st 2019

- A Category 5 Hurricane
- 2332 people are impacted
- 8 Schools are completed
- 1570 Children were able to go back to school
- Volunteer Work: Resilient Roof Repair & Rebuilt Program, Debris removal



The winds with 252 km/hour or higher speed are Category 5 Hurricanes which are expected to bring major catastrophic damages.



Peru Earthquake Relief



Santa Cruz, Peru



August 15th 2007

- Healthy school environment is provided to 204 students and counting
- 97 Volunteers participated
- 7 Classrooms are still in progress
- 9 Schools in total are repaired from 2008
- Volunteer Work: Classroom and toilet construction, sun shelter, building water retention tank
